This year we honor the Fowler Mansion, a Palo Alto residential treasure now identified as 1170 Ramona. This large shingled Colonial Revival home was built at 221 Kingsley Avenue in 1902 by Gustav Laumeister.

Over the years, the property was subdivided leaving this house with a too large front lawn. The current owners, Max and Nahid Keech, had the house rotated so it now faces Ramona Street.
